Catalog Course Description:

This course is a continuation of SPAN 101. It builds on the skills acquired in Spanish 101, and it is designed to provide students with the basic skills to communicate in Spanish. It introduces students to language structures of increased complexity while involving them in interactive communication. The class is taught almost entirely in Spanish by a communicative based language teaching approach.

Students will engage with other classmates in class and exchange real-world information through meaning-based activities. This course aims to provide the student with practice in all four language skills (reading, writing, listening, and speaking), and a strong emphasis on cultural awareness.

SPAN 102 is designed for beginners with basic background in Spanish. For example, students with prior experience in the language or those who have completed Spanish classes in High school or who have taken SPAN 101. Students with no experience must take Spanish 101.

Course Learning Outcomes: Upon successful completion of the course, students will be able to:

CLO1. Handle successfully a variety of basic <u>communicative tasks</u> such as giving the time/date, going shopping, ordering food, describing places and things, etc.
CLO2. Further develop <u>listening</u> and <u>reading</u> strategies in Spanish.
CLO3. Recognize and use <u>basic grammar</u> in conversational and written Spanish.
CLO4. Acquire and handle <u>new vocabulary</u> on varied topics colors, clothes, days of the week, food, etc.
CLO5. Identify <u>cultural expressions</u> of the Spanish speaking world.

Course Delivery/Methodology:

For this course we will be meeting in-person three times per week and material will be presented through PowerPoints/videos/readings done ahead of time. All course material will be posted on Moodle. Assignments must also be submitted through Moodle or the *Campus Difusion* website. You will be completing the following evaluations for this course: short quizzes, oral exams, compositions, group work, exams, etc. To successfully complete this course, you must complete readings ahead of time, actively participate in class discussions, and do all the homework by the posted due dates and times.
